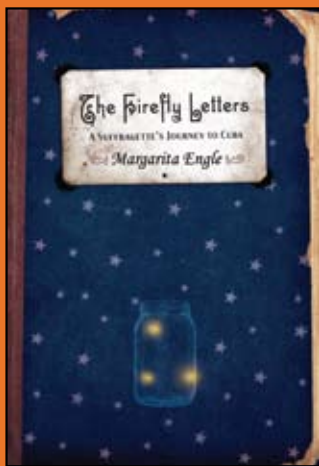

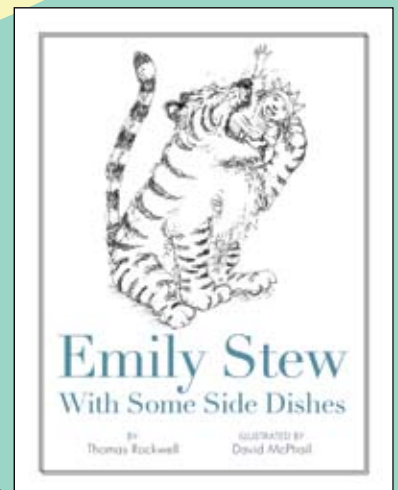

THOMAS ROCKWELL

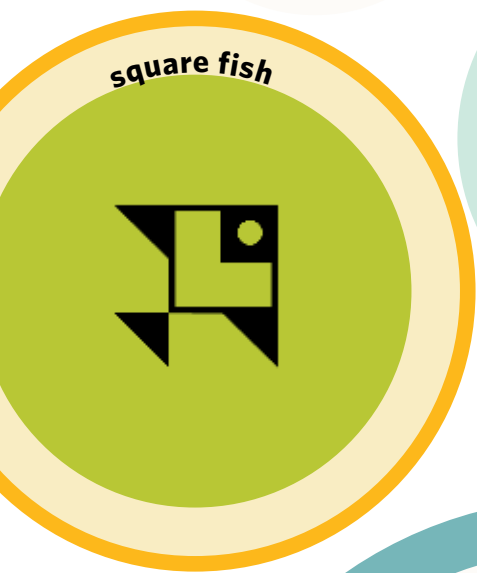
